

# Year 5 Term 1 Overview

Welcome to year 5 2024, we have had a excellent start to the year already it has been fantastic to see everyone back at school starting strong! #### English: Examining and creating fantasy texts

#### Focus:

Students listen to, read and interpret a novel from the fantasy genre showing understanding of character development in relation to plot and setting. They analyse the development of a main character through a written response. They create the first chapter of a fantasy novel, depicting contrasting fantasy characters in relation to setting and plot.

#### Students will:

- Use language features to show how ideas can be extended.
- Demonstrate understanding of grammar using a variety of sentence types.
- Create an imaginative text for purpose and audience. (structure)
- Edit work for cohesive structure and meaning.

#### Assessment Tasks

Week 8 — To create an imaginative short story, creating a 'good' and 'evil' character, creating a setting.

### **Mathematics**

#### Focus:

Students investigate time concepts and the measurement of time, read and represent 24-hour time, measure dimensions, estimate and measure the perimeters of rectangles, investigate metric units of area measurement, estimate and calculate area of rectangles. They order chance events, apply probability to games of chance, make predictions in chance experiments. They will also read and represent 24hr time and convert between 12 and 24hr time.

Students will:

- Interpret different data sets.
- List outcomes of chance experiments with equally likely outcomes and assign probabilities between 0 and 1.
- Pose questions to gather data, and construct data displays appropriate for the data.

#### Assessment Tasks:

- Calculating time and identifying factors and multiples Week 6 and 8
- Describing chance and probability Week 9

# Science: Survival in the environment

#### Focus:

Students analyse the structural features and behavioural adaptations that assist living things to survive in their environment. They understand that science involves using evidence and comparing data to develop explanations. Students investigate the relationships between the factors that influence how plants and animals survive in their environments, including those that survive in extreme environments, and use this knowledge to design creatures with adaptations that are suitable for survival in prescribed environments.

#### Students will:

- Analyse how the form of living things enables them to function in their environments
- Describe ways to improve the fairness of their investigations, and communicate their ideas and findings using multimodal texts

#### Assessment Task:

\* Survival in the environment! - Week 8

# HASS: Participating in Australian communities

#### Focus:

In Term 2, students will conduct an inquiry to answer the following inquiry question: How have people enacted their values and perceptions about their community, other people and places, past and present?

Students will:

- Identify the importance of values and processes to Australia's democracy and describe the roles of different people in Australia's legal system.
- Describe different views on how to respond to an issue or challenge.
- Work with others to generate alterative responses to an issue or challenge and reflect on their learning to independently propose action, describing the possible effects of their proposed action.

# Health and Physical Education

#### Focus:

In Physical Education (P.E), develop specialised football skills and create and perform a sequence of these skills to music.

In Health, students recognise that emotions and behaviours influence how people interact. They understand that relationships are established and maintained by applying skills. Students identify practices that keep themselves and others safe and well.

# The Arts — Music

#### Focus:

This semester, students make and respond to music exploring pieces of music that tell a story, and music that appears in film.

Students will:

- Explain how elements of music are used to communicate meaning in the music they listen to, compose and perform
- Describe how their music making is influenced by music and performances from different cultures, times and places
- Use rhythm, pitch and form symbols and terminology to compose and perform music
- Sing and play music in different styles, demonstrating aural, technical and expressive skills by signing and playing instruments with accurate pitch, rhythm and expression in performances for audiences

#### Assessment Task:

\* Going to the movies: Collection of work - Week 9

### The Arts — Media arts

#### Focus:

Students explore light and shadow in media art forms to create representations and meaning for an audience.

Students will:

- Explain how points of view, ideas and stories are shaped and portrayed in media artworks they make, share and view
- Explain the purposes and audiences for media artworks made in different cultures, times and places
- Work collaboratively using technologies to make media artworks for specific audiences and purposes using story
  principles to shape points of view and genre conventions, movement and lighting
