This funding will be used to:

- Build the capability of teachers to deliver engaging, high impact teaching and learning experiences that accelerate student learning (analyse data, differentiate teaching and learning, and monitor progress).
- Increase the percentage of **Prep students** reaching PM Benchmark <u>Reading</u> Level 7 to 65%.
- Year 3 NAPLAN: Increase the percentage of students at or above the 'National Minimum Standard' in Reading to 95%.
- Year 3 NAPLAN: Increase the percentage of students reaching the 'Upper Two Bands' in Reading to 35%.
- Year 3 NAPLAN: 100% of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at or above the 'National Minimum Standard' in Reading.
- Year 5 NAPLAN: Increase the percentage of students at or above the 'National Minimum Standard' in Reading to 90%.
- Year 5 NAPLAN: Increase the percentage of students at or above the 'Upper Two Bands' in Reading to 25%.
- Writing moderation: 75% of all students at or above a C Standard as per marking guide.

- Establish a Professional Learning Community to promote high quality teaching and learning, which empowers students to engage in deep learning and achieve growth each year.
- Implement high impact teaching strategies that have the greatest impact on student outcomes.

- Implement early intervention and speech programs to improve oral language of students in Prep to Year 2.
- Implement reading intervention programs across Prep Year 6.
- Focus professional learning on teaching of Reading (Cameron) and Writing (Cameron & Dempsey).
